



## Crete 24 September to 06 October 2006

Not a birding holiday at all, just a couple of early morning bike rides along the coast from Platania (around 13km west of Chania on the northern coast) towards Tavronitis, a couple of dawn trips to Aghia Lake and a day out in a hire car (with children). In other words rather less than usual, even for a family holiday. Generally plenty of birds to be seen all over the place – though often hard to obtain good views. Cetti's and Sardinian Warbler everywhere, along with huge flocks of hirundines on the move. Common Buzzard were plentiful in all but the most built up of areas.

Bearing in mind the few hours spent actually birding, the total of over 70 species was not too disappointing. All in all Crete was again a fantastic place to visit from all points of view with the exception of the continuing development along the coast making it difficult to get away from things without heading inland.

We were once again lucky with the choice of hotel – all the 100s of Cory's Shearwater, all but one of the many Eleonora's falcons and the vast majority of European Shag were seen from the hotel balcony. On some days raptors (largely Common Buzzard and Marsh Harriers) could be seen flying in off the sea and flocks of Little Egret and Grey Heron were regular heading west along the coast – all visible from the hotel room.

A hire car (or even a day spent birding properly) would have no doubt increased the number and variety of birds further.

Highlights were all from 04 October – in the form of a light phase Booted Eagle at Aghia Lake, good numbers of Griffon Vultures in the hills, Cirl Bunting at Omalos and the Chough flock at Samaria. For a Norwegian birder the good numbers of Kingfisher both along the coast and at Aghia Lake were another undoubted highlight.

Itinerary was as follows:

- 27<sup>th</sup> September: cycle along the coast to Tavronitis
- 29<sup>th</sup> September: cycle to Aghia Lake
- 30<sup>th</sup> September: cycle to Aghia Lake
- 04<sup>th</sup> October: drive to Omalos and Samaria Gorge
- 05<sup>th</sup> October: cycle to Tavronitis
